**PRELIMINARY SUMMARY MINUTES –
VADA/Nova Board Meeting
March 12, 2012– Morven Park Lounge**

The meeting was called to order at 7:15 p.m. Thirteen of the Board members were present and two were excused. There was one guest.

The Feb 2012 minutes were accepted by the Board.

Treasurer’s Report: Dilly was unable to provide a reconciled balance as no February statement was received by meeting time for our main operating account. Dilly will check with the bank to see what the problem is and may sign up for on-line banking to avoid these problems in the future. She did note that all 1099s were sent out on time. In addition, she noted that when we get our March statement, our balance will reflect 2 sizeable recent purchases, new radios for use at our shows (approx. \$3700) and our show ribbons (almost \$10,000.) Dilly will receive the initial deposits from the April show when she attends the Region 1 meeting on 3/18.

Licensed Shows: April Show - Dianne Boyd reported that as of the meeting date, we had received about 63 entries, which is pretty good considering we are still a few weeks out. An e-blast will go out correcting the typo in the prize list on the closing date. So far, there is good representation in the entries, with at least some entries in all the developing horse/qualifying classes. This year, all of these classes will be in Bedford, rather than the indoor, based upon competitors input. Morven is in good shape, with a lot of work being done on the facility and particularly the footing in the indoor. We have done a price comparison among 3 different vendors for lunches for the officials and volunteers. South Street Under submitted the best bid, so we will stick with them for the sandwiches and purchase our own “add-on’s (salad/pasta salad and desserts.) There is also a new food vendor this year for the Café and Dianne has been working with him on menu ideas. We will use him this year for the March schooling show, as a small scale dry run. Volunteers are starting to come in, but there are still some critical gaps. Michelle Lachner is the volunteer recruiter for this show.

June – we need to start initial planning now, working to get sponsors and on the competitor’s party. In addition to this show once again hosting the Young Horse Selection Trials, the USEF has selected this show as the site of one of its Judge’s Forums (a continuing education session for judges.) Alison will coordinate with USEF to see what their needs are.

Schooling Shows: Our March show is very large, running from 8 to 5:15, with a lunch judge (Jen Moran) to accommodate as many rides as possible. The opening date for the next schooling show at Compass Rose is 3/19. For our October show, like last year, costumes will be encouraged (but not required) with prizes for various categories.

Membership: As of 3/12, we had 292 members, which is very close to where we were last year at the same time.

Clinics & Education: We held 2 unmounted winter clinics so far. Dr. Lee’s session was great, but it was too lightly attended.

The continuing education session for judges and L graduates was well attended and well received. The evaluations were excellent and the only request was for a longer session next time. The final session (The View from C) led by Alison Head will be on 3/21.

Plans are underway for our summer riding clinic with Herbert Seiberl of the Spanish Riding School, which will be July 6, 7 & 8 at Morven Park Equestrian Center. More information, including rider applications and auditor registration forms will be posted on the website soon.

Banquet Report: 146 people attended, the facility bill was \$5159.75. We took in \$4965 in cash and 740 dollars in VN Bucks. The silent auction raised approx. \$4500 and we netted \$700 on the basket raffle.

New Business:

We will work with both CDCTA and PVDA on occasional ad swapping in the newsletter to help promote important events. Alison will follow up with both clubs.

Alison briefed the group on the newly created Loudoun County Equine Alliance and passed around the introductory letter they are asking equine stakeholders to circulate with the goal of building their data base. We agreed that this was an initiative VN should support and will explore the best ways for us to do so.

Dianne Boyd filled everyone in on the status of the Meadows Event Park, which has declared bankruptcy and cancelled all events scheduled there (including the VADA Chapter Challenge.) It is an important reminder to us how vital Morven Park is to our continued success and how we need to support them however we can.

The meeting concluded at 8:30 and the next board meeting is April 9th.

Coggins certificate-What's all the fuss about???

Have you ever wondered why VADA/Nova insists that the name of the horse on your entry must match the name on your Coggins and why we insist on a current Coggins before allowing you to show? There is a very good reason for this.

At random, the Virginia Department of Agriculture can audit a show, checking to make sure all paperwork is in order concerning negative Coggins reports.

They will either send an inspector to a show or have a form that the management team needs to fill out and submit within 2 weeks. The form must list the horse, owner, and the date of negative Coggins test. If there is a questionable Coggins (such as entry name not matching the Coggins) or horse without one, the state vet has the right to quarantine all the horses on the facility if he/she wishes.

Our March 24 schooling show was selected for inspection for at least the 2nd time! Here are some excerpts from the VA Dept. of Agriculture and Consumer Services, Rules and Regulations:

“All horses assembled at a show in Virginia must be accompanied by a report of an official negative test for EIA (Coggins) conducted within 12 months prior to the event. The person in charge will ensure that a copy of the official negative test results accompanies each horse in the event and shall make such reports available for inspection by a representative of the State Veterinarian upon request. **The person in charge shall exclude any horse which is not accompanied by a negative test report.**”

“The horses that do not have an accompanying Coggins report that is dated within the last 12 months must be excluded from entry into your event! The date of the Coggins report is the date that the blood was drawn by the veterinarian and not the date reported by the laboratory.”

So what can you do to prevent any snafus? When having your new Coggins drawn, have your vet write the horse's registered, barn and show names (if different) on the report. If you're not due for a new Coggins any time soon, then please enter your horse with the name shown on the Coggins.

As a side note, if you're considering year-end awards, please enter your horse with the same name at each show. Otherwise it will look like you're riding two different horses. Or you may have the secretary list both barn and registered names-we have several people doing that.

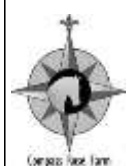

FAQs

Q: Why are you writing this article in Q & A format?

That was definitely the right call, as we would have had a ton of scratches, not to mention waterlogged volunteers, riders, horses, and grooms.

Q: Was it a relaxing day?

A: Very funny. We ran the show through lunch with a second judge to accommodate as many additional riders as we could. Because of that, the volunteers had to eat lunch in shifts. As I feared, most of the volunteers barely even paused for lunch and continued working. So there was really no time during the day when everyone could relax. Nevertheless, all the volunteers stayed enthusiastic and on task throughout the long day.

Q: Who were the volunteers?

A: Kelly Weatherhead was a very effective scribe. The mother-daughter team of Kim and Lauren Rapp were efficient runners, and Kim was always helping with setting up tables, supplementing hospitality items, etc. Dorie Forte was an awesome ring steward. Veteran scorer Karoline Morris helped neophyte scorer Joe Verga learn the scoring ropes, and together they were a well-oiled scoring machine. Amy Chipman is back as a VADA/Nova volunteer (and rider) after several years away finishing up her nursing studies. She handled awards adeptly and also scribed at lunch. Julia Shawn spent the day learning the ropes as Assistant Manager and pitching in where needed. Marianne Reichel helped Secretary extraordinaire Joanne Hodges organize the voluminous entries in advance of the show to ensure that nothing fell through the cracks. Many thanks to all of them for their help with this show and support of VADA/Nova!

Q: Why were there no chapped lips at the show?

A: Everyone was using Avon lip balms that Bright Moon Farm in Winchester generously provided to all volunteers and competitors at the show.

Q: I don't get it. What does a farm have to do with lip balm?

A: Owner Trish Conk is an Avon representative.

Q: Why was the show secretary such a stickler about Coggins?


A: For the second year in a row, the Virginia Department of Agriculture audited this show's Coggins compliance. Joanne (as well as the organizers of all VADA/Nova riding events) must ensure that horses' names on the entries exactly match the names on the Coggins reports. This rule applies to every horse that comes onto the show grounds, and there can be no exceptions.

Q: What did you do about lunch?

A: We used the new Morven Park food vendor for the lunch for our volunteers to test them out before their official debut in the April licensed show. Menu selections included burgers, hot dogs, grilled cheese, salad, burritos and quesadillas. We heard many compliments about the food.

Q: How about the riding part of the show?

A: The show featured tests from Intro through Fourth Level, as well as a Second Level Musical Freestyle (beautifully performed by Katie Kelly on her 18-plus hand Figaro, scoring a 71%).

Q: Who won the High Score?

A: Trish Conk on her Shaman (aka Scotty) won the High Score for her Training 3 score of 70.8%. It was wonderful to see this pair back together after three years away from the show ring. On a personal note, Trish has generously allowed me to ride Scotty in the dressage Pilates clinics she has hosted at her farm, so it was especially nice to see the pair do so well together.

Q: Did anyone else help with the show?

A: This is the third year that Joanne and I have run this show together, and she has become a truly amazing secretary. In addition to the volunteers mentioned previously, there is a lot of thankless behind the scenes work performed by VADA/Nova Board Members for every event that we put on – so thanks to Sheli King for dealing with the facility contracts and prizes; Rebecca Woodward-Davis for doing the judges' contracts and President Alison Head for signing them; Treasurer Dilly Jackson for writing the checks; Webmaster Judy Grass for posting the times and results; Vice President Barb Pickering for picking up the checks, and official scores at the end of the show and making sure that the show information is entered in the newsletter and on the website; and Michelle Lachner, schooling show co-chair and equipment manager, for helping me pick up the show equipment from storage, set up the morning of the show, and then schlep everything back to the storage unit afterwards. Thanks to all the Board members for helping make this show and all VADA/Nova events a success!

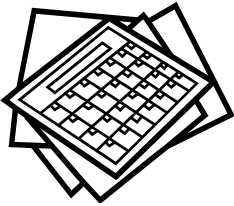

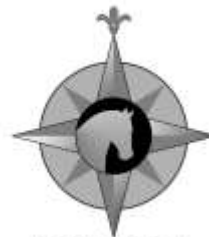
